



Finding National Presentations in Insight



For the majority of school-based users, the default establishment shown in Insight will be their school.

It can be useful to reflect upon SCQF presentations across Scotland. This “National” picture can support reflection and analysis of your own school attainment data and provide useful context for curriculum offer and presentation levels within a school.

Users can change the establishment and have Insight present Scotland-wide attainment and presentation figures. This is known as “The National Establishment”. School users also have access to their own Local Authority information as well.

Finding National Presentation Figures


Users will see their school name shown on a button approx. half way along the top menu. By clicking on this button users can change establishment to National Establishment or Local Authority data. *(Note that filtered access to all schools is granted to all users. Simply select any school you see under Change Establishment. **Deep Dive 10** has more information on Learner Partners and obtaining full access to other schools' data.)*





Insight will now be displaying the landing screen dashboard, set to National Establishment.

To find National Presentation levels across course types and SCQF levels select “Course” and then “Whole School Course Summary”.



The default under “Whole School Course Summary” is Advanced Higher. For the purpose of this paper we will initially look at S4 presentations.


Let’s start with SQA courses. Select the “Change Options” button and:

Ensure **Data Provider** is set to Scottish Qualifications Authority

Product Type: Course - National


Qualification Level: National 5

Stage: S4





You can then make use of the “Download Data” button to download this information as a spreadsheet. (*During Advisor visits this National data is often compared to school data to allow reflection on presentation levels and curriculum opportunities*).



Once you have obtained the S4 National 5 presentation data for The National Establishment, you can then go back to “Change Options” and get further information about the other courses / levels and year groups you are interested in. Download the data each time and add these as tabs to your original spreadsheet.

Suggestions on what other data you may wish to obtain to collate a broad attainment picture across Scotland are:

Data Provider: SQA
Product Type: Course – National
Qualification Level: Higher (*and then National 1 through to 4*)
Stage: S4

Data Provider: SQA
Product Type: Course – National Progression Award
Qualification Level: SCQF Level 5 (*and then Levels 1 through to 4, and 6*)
Stage: S4

Data Provider: SQA
Product Type: Course – Skills for Work
Qualification Level: SCQF Level 5 (*and then Levels 1 through to 4, and 6*)
Stage: S4

Data Provider: SQA
Product Type: Course - Award
Qualification Level: SCQF Level 5 (*and then Levels 1 through to 4, and 6*)
Stage: S4

You can also change “Data Provider” from SQA to other Award Providers (such as Open University) that share attainment data with us. **Deep Dive 2** has further information on Wider Award Providers.



Once you have obtained this National overview you can return Insight to your own Establishment. By going through “Whole School Course Summary” for your own setting you can build up your own spreadsheet and compare your school data to National data.

If any of your learners were presented for Awards in other settings (College, other schools) then you may wish to make use of Partnership Summary to surface any obtainment your learners gained away from their base centre.

In your analysis you may wish to consider:

- **Presentation rates** – how do subject presentation rates in your school compare to National presentation rates?
- **Quality of passes** – in graded courses, how do subject A/B/C/D/NAs compare to National rates? (Note that presentation rates *may* impact on quality of awards)
- **Curriculum offer** – how broad is your curriculum offer? Can you learn from “what others are doing” across Scotland?
